### ▶▶ Sweet Home Senior Applies Classroom Skills to Save Lives

Tori Benson is a senior from Sweet Home High School and is enrolled in the Emergency Medical Services program at Erie 1 BOCES Kenton Career & Technical Center.

"I enrolled in BOCES because I wanted to pursue a career as an emergency medical technician and a firefighter," Tori said.

In the fall of 2023, following graduation, Tori plans on becoming an EMT for American Medical Response, Inc. (AMR).

Under the instruction of Don Turner III, Tori has learned about anatomy and physiology, pharmacology, patient assessment and more.

"When she doesn't succeed on her first attempt at a skill or idea, Tori works hard and practices until she achieves mastery," Turner said. "She's a leader in the classroom and frequently helps her classmates practice and learn new skills. Tori is also a volunteer firefighter with Eggertsville Hose Co., where she applies the skills and ideas she learns in the program to real patients and situations."

"This program has allowed me to obtain my EMT certification in high school, and it has helped me find a job with AMR right after graduating," Tori said.

As part of public education, Erie 1 BOCES offers a variety of career and technical programs during the regular school day to high school students in Erie County.
