Western New York Project SEARCH Collaborative is a business-led partnership which offers a school-towork program alternative for students with disabilities.

GOAL

Each intern goes through a series of job rotations lasting up to ten weeks. They receive support with necessary modifications during on-the-job training. The goal is for each intern to obtain competitive, integrated employment in their community.

- Interns will attend classes at Beechwood Homes securing daily life skills.
- Interns participate in unpaid job rotations throughout Beechwood including: Health Information, Management Operations, Environmental Services, Dining Services and Admissions.
- Aspire of WNY and The Summit Center provide job coaching until the task can be performed independently.

Eligibility Criteria

- Students ages 18–21 who are eligible for ACCES-VR and/or OPWDD services.
- Current Individual Education Plan.
- All academic requirements for high school must be completed.
- Independence in self-care

Placement in Project SEARCH is determined by a school district's Committee on Special Education.

Upon successful completion of the program, a student will earn the Skills & Achievement Commencement Credential.
